What we are Learning

The first two weeks of January we will begin our study on boxes and buildings. We will be talking about how boxes are made, how people use boxes, how people move large boxes, how many sides they have, and how high we can stack them. In this unit students will use boxes to build a fort, a rocket ship, a palace, an apartment, a skyscraper or other imaginative structures. After building structures, the students will be able to play inside and around their creation as well knock them down at the end of the class. This unit helps encourage teamwork, encourages trial and error, expands students' imagination, and promotes other open-ended discoveries. The third week will have many winter activities planned; We will make tissue paper snowman, watercolor mittens, and make icicle art. The last week of January we will be making music. During the music unit we will listen to music, make music, and move to music while learning about musical instruments, rhythm, and music as story telling.
